

## Visual crosswords

Crossword solving involves several useful skills including vocabulary, reasoning, spelling and word attack skills.



A visual-crossword is a crossword where clue sentences are replaced by pictures (visual clues).



# Visual crosswords can be used in language class:

- To acquire new vocabulary or terminology or subjectspecific vocabulary;
- Correctly deciphering a crossword also requires exact spelling;
- Another benefit of using crossword puzzles is that they are associated with recreation, and can be less intimidating for students as review tools.

 Visual learners often have strong puzzlesolving skills, and feel great satisfaction when they complete one



Crossword puzzles have the benefit of being customizable to study content. Free Puzzle creation software and websites are abundant, and easy to use:

On internet (e.g. Google images search)




Clipart collections







 With a scanner from books (e.g. illustrated dictionaries use pictures to group words together into logical groups)








